

Ministry of Government Legislation helped the public officials of Indonesia strengthen their legislative capability

- From August 25 to September 4, an invitational training program for enhancing legislative capability was held for 22 public officials of the Cabinet Secretariat of Indonesia.

The Ministry of Government Legislation (MOLEG, Minister Lee Wan-kyu) announced that it conducted an invitational training program for Indonesian public officials from August 25 to September 4. The training program, named "Capability Building for Legislative Improvement in Indonesia," is part of the Global Training Program of the Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA). The training, which began in 2023, was attended by 22 public officials of the Cabinet Secretariat of the Republic of Indonesia* with over three years of legislative experience.

* The Cabinet Secretariat is a presidential agency responsible for overseeing laws and regulations, coordinating opinions among relevant government agencies when drafting legislation, and reviewing the drafts.

MOLEG has been actively cooperating with the Cabinet Secretariat in the field of legislation since President Joko Widodo's visit to South Korea in 2018. In accordance with the Action Plan for exchange and cooperation signed by the two organizations, MOLEG was invited to a seminar hosted by the Cabinet Secretariat on August 7, where it shared Korea's legislative experiences related to the economy and social welfare.

This training program was designed based on the requests of the Cabinet Secretariat, focusing on practical contents such as the procedures of making and examining legislative drafts for ministerial decrees and modification of laws and regulations regarding economic investment.

In addition, the Indonesian trainees visited various legislative organizations such as MOLEG and the Korea Legislation Research Institute, and the Global Knowledge Exchange and Development Center operated by the Ministry of Economy and Finance, which helped them strengthen their legislative capability and improve their understanding of Korea's economic development.

The trainees will share what they learned from this 11-day training program with their colleagues and utilize that to improve the legislative capability of the Cabinet Secretariat.

"This training program has provided an opportunity to reaffirm and solidify the friendship and cooperation between MOLEG and the Cabinet Secretariat," Minister Lee Wan-kyu said. "We will continue our cooperation with the Cabinet Secretariat for legislative development of both countries."

MOLEG is planning to actively disseminate Korea's exemplary laws and regulations to other Asian countries. Additionally, we will make efforts to promote legislative cooperation to explore ways for Asian countries to jointly respond to the changes caused by climate change and advancements in artificial intelligence (AI).

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
